MEDICATION POLICY

As part our medication policy we will be sending out a form for you to fill if you want your son/daughter to take any medication in school. Please remember that any medication is to be kept in the school office apart from an asthma pump. The full policy can be seen on the school website or you can contact us to request a paper copy.

ADVERSE WEATHER AND CLOSING SCHOOL

If a situation arises that we have to close school for reasons beyond our control—weather, no electricity or water, etc; we will try to send a text message to every home to inform you. We can text message every home within minutes—so long as we have a valid mobile phone number.

We will also make an announcement on Radio Cymru between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. and on the Council website - www.gwynedd.gov.uk

If we have to close school during the day and have to send pupils home for health and safety reasons we will follow these procedures:-

- i. pupils should return home on the school bus (if that is how they come to school)
- ii. pupils should then return to their home or the house of a relative or friend (according to your instructions).

BULLYING

Bullying is not a serious problem in Ysgol Botwnnog. However when bullying occurs staff will strive to prevent further bullying. The school has an Anti Bullying Policy with strategies to deal with victims and bullies. We want our pupils to be happy and safe in school. We will not tolerate bullying. Pupils are aware that they can talk to Year 11 Buddies or members of staff to report on bullying.

As parents / guardians you can contact me or the deputy to discuss bullying or report on any incidences of bullying (bullying in school, on the bus, or through mobile or social networking such as Facebook, Twitter.)

Bullying is not accepted in Ysgol Botwnnog and dealing with bullying is a priority for staff. Posters by pupils on school walls remind pupils that bullying is wrong and not acceptable. Pupils and staff are responsible for maintaining a safe environment in the school.




OUTSTANDING ATTENDANCE

WHAT IS GOOD ATTENDANCE?

90% sounds good (such exam mark would be very praiseworthy). However the same isn't true for attendance.

ABSENCE—INFORMING US

To ensure that everybody who should be in school is present please contact the school on the first morning of absence so that we know if your son / daughter should be here or not.

We ask you to let us know if your son / daughter is absent by calling 01758 730220 between 8:00 and 9:15.

If the school hasn't received a call by 9:15 telling us why your child is not in school, then we will contact your home or workplace.

APPLICATION FOR HOLIDAY FAMILY DURING THE TERM

Following guidance from the Welsh Government, the County Council has recommended that their schools authorize no more than 5 days holiday / visits for Key Stage 3 (years 7,8,9) pupils and not to authorize any holiday at Key Stage 4 (years 10 and 11) during the school term.

We will adhere to this guidance at Ysgol Botwnnog. Any absences outside these limits shall be recorded as unauthorized absence. The Authority's Education Welfare Officer monitors unauthorized absences weekly and if there are 10 or more of them this could result in a fixed penalty notice.

Before going on vacation or other visits during the term parents should contact the Headteacher to receive permission to remove the child from school.

YEAR 11 - 2015

RESULTS—SUMMER 2015

This year 11's results were good. 86% of Year 11 pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at grades A* - C (83 % in 2014).

The vast majority of year 11 (88%) have embarked on courses at colleges or sixth forms, 5% have started an apprenticeship and 5% have started working.

Congratulations and best wishes to the pupils for their future. Thanks to the teachers and parents for preparing the students so thoroughly and supporting them over the last two years.

YEAR 10 AND 11

The work accomplished during these two years could steer the course of the rest of your son/daughter's life. We are here to try, with your support, to ensure that every pupil is moving in the right direction.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS

Year 10 and 11 pupils will be sitting EXTERNAL exams (which WILL count toward their ratings limits) several times during the two years:

CONTROLLED ASSESSMENTS (Coursework)

Controlled Assessments (previously called coursework) is important in most GCSE subjects. They count between 20% and 60% of the final mark in almost every subject.

These are held throughout years 10 and 11 in various subjects - from first lesson in Year 10 until May in Year 11.

Most of these have to be completed within a specific number of hours under the supervision of a teacher - so if your son/daughter is absent from lessons then they will have to catch up, at lunchtime or after school.

WELSH BAC (year 10)

A new BAC course starts for year 10 this year. 4 controlled assessments need to be completed over a period of two years to win the Foundation Challenge Award or National Challenge Award. Pupils must also pass at least five GCSEs (or equivalent) to win the full BAC qualification.

HOMEWORK

Homework is an important tool to improve the standard of your son/daughter's work. The Homework policy and timetable will be sent to you in due course. Keeping an eye over your son/daughter as they complete their homework is a good way to keep track of how they are doing in school. Homework is recorded on a form that is glued in each book.

If a pupil fails to complete homework then they will be punished:

- The subject teacher will give them a warning at first instance;
- If the work is still not completed after the warning then the pupils can be kept in at break / lunch;
- The teacher can refer a pupil who continues not to complete work to the attention of head of department and will lead to the pupil being monitored or kept in for longer;
- If this does not solve the problem, the pupil is referred to the Deputy or Headmaster who will liaise with parents/guardians of the pupils to discuss the way forward. This may include the pupils staying in the Homework Club after school or not being allowed to go on trips or visits.

The same actions are followed if a pupil misbehaves in any other way in lessons or around the school.

HOMEWORK CLUB

Every Monday and Wednesday from 3:30 to 5:00 there is an opportunity for pupils to stay at school in the Library and Resource Centre to complete work. A member of staff will be available to help them if needed.

Arrangements can be made for your son / daughter to stay in the homework club by contacting the school .

WORK / COACHING ROOM

Pupils can take the opportunity to work at break / lunch in the Library or the Resource Room. They can also go to room 7 where they can get support from a staff member if they are struggling with their work.

"EVERY CHILD COUNTS, EVERY DAY COUNTS"

During the past year at Ysgol Botwnnog we have been reviewing two aspects of school life and developing and improving our policies.

1. Attendance

Regular attendance (96%) is considered very important and without it all our efforts to provide high quality education would be futile. If a pupil is not present at school he / she can not learn or reach their true potential. Children who are not in school are missing education, social opportunities and experiences essential to develop life skills. Eventually, research has proven that this well lead to poorer results in the examinations. Our attendance policy states that we can not authorize term time holidays for any pupil in Year 10 or 11, and only for 5 days, when in receipt of a written application letter in advance, in years 7, 8 and 9. Otherwise the absence will be recorded as unauthorised on your child's report. All pupils have a target of 96% attendance over their 5 years at school. If attendance during this period falls only to 90% this is equivalent to missing half a year's lessons! When your child is sick they must be kept home but only for the minimum time required to recover, otherwise if suffering from minor ailments such as colds or headaches they should be sent to school. Remember that the County Council have both a duty and responsibility to monitor your child's attendance and to act accordingly if it is deteriorating.

2. Equality

The right of each pupil to the best education without prejudice is core to our belief and at Ysgol Botwnnog we oppose all kinds of prejudice and differentiation and recognise that everyone has differing needs and aspirations. At Ysgol Botwnnog we respect individuals whatever their:-

- Ethnic background
- Sex
- Age
- Marital Status
- Sexual Orientation
- Disability
- Religion (or atheism)
- Language
- Nationality
- Dependants

Our aims are to:-

- Create an ethos of safety and appreciation
- Create a feeling of self-respect
- Set high expectations of students and parents
- Give due consideration to learning needs
- Recognize clear strategies in response to incidents of differentiation
- Challenge stereotypes and prejudiced behaviour
- Promote positive images
- Reduce bullying year on year.

This is true of the Governing Body, Senior Management Team, all staff, visitors and contractors working at the school.
